- When you think of all the relationships in your life, what are some of the greatest challenges that they all have in common? Why do you think relationships, even the best of them, are so difficult?

- 3. John the Baptist invited those around Him to an initial "come and see" meeting with to begin their relationship with Him as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world". Why do you think our relationship with Jesus must begin there?
- 4. Why did Jesus rename Simon? As Simon remained with Jesus, Jesus changed his character. If Jesus were going to choose a new name for you, what would it be and why?
- 5.
